Mesa Verde National Park

> 700 Years Bus Tour (half-day tours of ruins, departing 8:00 am and 1:30 pm)

Note: If there are 20 people who know they want to do this in advance, we can get a group contract with reduced pricing (\$61 instead of \$75 per person). However, if you prefer to wait to decide on arrival—pending weather and other factors—I am told you can almost always find a seat on the afternoon tour at the last minute.

Capitol Reef National Park

- Wilderness Ridge Trail Llamas (2-, 4- and 8-hour hikes with llamas, plus horseback rides)
- Backcountry Safaris (guided day trip with driver in covered Jeeps, limit 2 vehicles)
- Fremont River Guides (guided backcountry excursions in Suburban/Yukon-type vehicles; guided or self-drive tours on ATVs/UTVs; fly-fishing on private 10-mile stretch of Fremont River; photography tours, etc.)

Death Valley National Park

Farabee's Jeep Rentals (self-drive rental and tours with driver/guides)

Note: It seems like there are a good handful of people who are interested in the full-day (you drive) Jeeping excursion using Farabee's rented Jeeps. We've talked to them already, and they've advised us to get back in touch with them once they are back at Furnace Creek for the season (September 1st), and I will do so. The sooner we can secure the 4-door vehicles, the better!

Some of you may have seen the news about the recent "air show" at Star Wars Canyon in Death Valley, where an F-18 Hornet crashed during maneuvers, killing the pilot and inflicting bystanders with minor injuries. You may keep that in mind if contemplating a stop at the overlook!

DENVER ARRIVAL

We recently surveyed the progress with Sheltair, the newer FBO at Rocky Mountain Regional (BJC) airport, and they do not seem to have progressed on their new building at all! As suspected, we will be using Signature Flight Support instead, and will make sure they have a current list of Parkwest tail numbers for your arrival. If we are able to negotiate fuel discounts or other concessions, we will let you know.

Please let me know your travel plans once they are known, even if they are vague or unconfirmed. It will help me (Mother Goose) keep track of your progress getting to Denver for the start of the tour. Should you desire an extra night at the tour hotel, the Renaissance City Center, let me know, and I'll add you to the pre-tour rooming list.
